## 4. P5 Health Screening and Immunization

The annual health screening conducted by the School Health Services (SHS) can detect common conditions among children. The extent in planning the schedule hopes to minimise any disruption to your child's classes. The types of screening activities for P5 include:

- Vision screening (Eyesight test)
- Growth & development assessment
- Spinal screening for girls only\*
- Medical check-up by doctor

\* The spinal screening is to check for abnormal curvature of the backbone. This screening is for girls only because the condition is more common in girls of this age.

After the health screening, your child will be given a copy of the Health Assessment Summary Report. Besides health screening, your child will be immunized against Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus and Poliovirus. Diphtheria and measles vaccinations are **COMPULSORY** by law for 11 to 12 years old.

To prepare your child for pre and post vaccination, ensure that your child eats healthily and drink lots of water. Avoid fried food and fast food and drink water or herbal drink according to grandparents.

#### **5. P5 CL eOral**

From 2017, Chinese oral for PSLE will be a new format. During oral, your child will go through an on-screen Reading Aloud and the use of short video clip as stimulus for Conversation. This will be the format in P5.

#### **6. Code of Conduct for Examination**

Please play your part in reminding your child to abide by the code of conduct for examination. It is mandatory. There should not be any form of communication before the start, during or end of an examination. At times, a moment of child's play or folly may cause undesirable anguish for you and me.

#### **7. Movement from P5 to 6**

At the end of P4, the letter on Subject Based Banding reinforced the objectives for the briefing in the middle of the year. This is to reinforce that the school will decide on subject combination based on your child's performance at the end of P5.
